The Rivkin Center's Ovarian Cancer Research Program continues to fund life-saving science around the world, to ensure that the best and brightest minds are working on finding solutions to ovarian cancer. With the help of passionate donors like you, we've funded more than \$13 million in research aimed at the prevention, early detection, and treatment of the disease. It is an exciting time for the ovarian cancer community with many ground-breaking projects underway, but federal funding remains increasingly scarce. Because of your support, our Education Program, Rivkin EDU, has educated more than 30,000 women on ovarian and breast health, giving women the tools for early detection, prevention, and self-advocacy. Our strong team of education instructors, survivors, and ambassadors enables us to educate people throughout our community and on college campuses. We've increased our reach with a focus on underserved populations to ensure that everyone is empowered with the tools and knowledge to be their own ovarian and breast health advocate.

Thanks to your support, we are expanding our efforts even further through digital platforms to make a more significant impact for women. At the end of 2019, we launched a new digital risk assessment tool that helps identify women who might be at high risk for developing ovarian or breast cancer. By implementing our "Assess Your Risk" tool, we can identify individuals who are at high risk and impact the prevention of disease. The opportunity for growth with this program in the coming years is extremely exciting.

Our Rivkin Center community has been the driving force behind each of these achievements.

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NEW DIGITAL RISK ASSESSMENT TOOL

To further the mission of the Rivkin Center, we launched a new online ovarian and breast cancer risk assessment quiz in December 2019 on our website. Knowledge is power and the goal of this effort is to help quickly identify women who might be at high risk. Identifying women at high risk may lead to prevention of ovarian, breast, and other cancers in those women and their close family members.

The tool is designed for individuals who are curious about their risk of ovarian and breast cancer, especially those with a history of cancer in their family. The simple tool will assess the risk of having a genetic mutation that increases risk for ovarian and breast cancer. There are only 4 questions, so it takes most people just a few minutes to complete, and the results are given immediately. Our new quiz is a screening tool, not a "yes" and "no" diagnostic test.

If someone is at high risk, the tool directs them to seek genetic counseling through the National Society of Genetic Counselors directory to evaluate their family history and discuss benefits and limitations of genetic testing for hereditary ovarian and/or breast cancer, and also explore existing prevention and screening opportunities.

IMPACT

- During the first two weeks of the tool being live, more than 483 people took the quiz to assess their risk.
- We are using our social channels and digital marketing to reach more women.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMS



IN 2019, WE AWARDED \$1,455,000 IN SCIENTIFIC GRANTS TO OVARIAN CANCER RESEARCHERS AROUND THE GLOBE.

The Rivkin Center received 167 applications for both Pilot Study and Scientific Scholar Awards for the 2019 funding period. Ovarian cancer continues to be an underfunded disease and the number of applications received reinforces importance of the work of the Rivkin Center, and the value of private funding for ovarian cancer research at a time when federal funding available for this type of work remains increasingly limited.

Since our inception in 1996, the Rivkin Center has awarded more than \$13 million in ovarian cancer research grants to scientific investigators around the world, making us one of the oldest and largest non-profit funders of ovarian cancer research.

IMPACT -

For every \$1 invested, Rivkin Center-funded researchers leverage an additional \$11.50 from other funding sources to further their ovarian cancer research.

SYMPOSIUM

The second biennial Northwest Gynecological Cancer Symposium was presented by the Rivkin Center on September 25, 2019 at the University of Washington in Seattle with more than 90 attendees. The Symposium brought together researchers from Washington, Oregon, and British Columbia to facilitate communication and foster collaboration between scientists working on the prevention, early detection, and treatment of gynecological cancers. Dr. Ronny Drapkin from the University of Pennsylvania gave the keynote address.

The Rivkin Center is proud to present the 13th Biennial Ovarian Cancer Research Symposium in partnership with the American Association for Cancer Research on September 26-28, 2020 at the Hyatt Regency in downtown Seattle.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The Rivkin Center's Education Program, Rivkin EDU, gives women the knowledge to be proactive about their health, giving them tools for prevention, early detection, and selfadvocacy for ovarian and breast cancer. Rivkin EDU educates women in communities throughout the Pacific Northwest, and at all of the PAC-12 college campuses through our sciencebased curriculum taught by a health instructor and an ovarian or breast cancer survivor who shares her cancer journey.




FAMILY & FRIENDS AUCTION
